From Pastor Lynn – Coram Deo

If you have listened you have heard me reference the prophetic utterance of **Isaiah 29:13**, "These people say they are Mine. They honor Me with their lips, but their hearts are far from Me. And their worship of Me is nothing but man-made rules learned by rote.

One of my greatest fears in my role as your pastor is that I just polish the surface or our accustomed routines but as a prophetic voice fail to penetrate the decisive *inner core*, the heart of who we are as individuals, as a church family. There is an ever present danger that we become so familiar with the verbiage and rituals of our faith that we separate both from really touching and transforming who we are at the core.

My prayer for 2019 is not that we perfect our faith routines but that we see and use them as a means to deepen our relationship with God Almighty. Thus the term 'Coram Deo' – Christian living in the presence of, under the authority of, and to the honor and glory of God.

My hope is that every worship brings a word, a touch, or a melody that we realize is *under the influence* of The Holy Spirit. If we anticipate that, then we will *long* for each corporate worship opportunity and like the Psalmist said, "as the deer longs for streams of water, so I <u>long</u> for You, O God." {Psa. 42:1}

With the exception of The Christian Church of Oklahoma, all the above entities are Tulsa centered. We're striving to *Make a Difference*, right here, right now. Thank you for making this possible.

Our final 2018 Stewardship figures were very encouraging. Total pledges and general fund offerings for the year totaled: **\$415,847**. There is no doubt that for a congregation our size this amount represents faithful, intentional, and sometimes sacrificial support. For 2018 we also received \$176,112 from Trust accounts and estate gifts. We ended 2018 with \$183,227 in our Contingency Fund, with additional funds in designated and restricted accounts some of which will help our 2019 expenditures.

Another First Christian Tulsa Legacy: SCHOLARSHIPS

Over decades individuals and families have contributed financially to enable FCCT to encourage and support individuals' educational pursuits. The vast percentage of scholarships specified enrollment in recognized Christian colleges and DOC related seminaries. Toward the end of 2017 FCC entered into an agreement with Phillips Theological Seminary to transfer the oversight of a number of scholarships from FCCT to PTS. Because PTS has a matching fund program, the FCCT scholarships that are being transferred will DOUBLE in their worth. This process used the entirety of 2018 to complete mainly due to legal requirements. We anticipate the process to be finalized shortly and **just over \$400,000** will move from FCCT Scholarships Fund to PTS Scholarships Fund. Our thanks to **Kathy Davis** and **Brian Knight** for their many hours of behind the scenes work on this project.

In December FCCT received appreciation letters from Brent Wiescamp, Angela Williams, and Leigh Isabelle Larson, all current PTS students who are benefitting from FCCT Scholarships.

Upon Further Reflection {What was left unsaid from last Sunday's message regarding 2019}

Some years ago I read a book entitled 'Sit, Walk, Stand' by Watchman Nee, A Chinese nationalist who wrote in the 1930's before WW2. He used the N.T. book of Ephesians as the basis of his devotional.

He wrote: Three Key Words summarize our adopted relationship as God's children:

SIT (Eph. 2:6) Realize, Reflect on **Our Position in Christ** by Grace

WALK (Eph. 4:1) Understand and Accept Our Role in the World as Light & Towel Bearers

STAND (Eph. 6:11) An Attitude of Firm Resistance to Our Spiritual Enemy drawing upon the strong resources of God.

There are times to **SIT** {i.e., 'be still & know' Psa. 46:10}, to recognize and reflect upon how God has blessed us and what He has already done for us, in spite of our reluctant and inconsistent faith.

There are also times to **WALK**, pursue with actions the course that clearly establishes us as Christ followers, i.e., *Disciples of Christ*. We don't have much of a witness or testimony if we are silent and passive.

We constantly **STAND** as sentinels ready to uphold Christ's Kingdom, His honor and glory.

May 2019 give us the discernment to know our *Chronos* time, i.e., the number of our days, weeks, and months; our *Kairos* time, i.e., the moments and seasons when our opportunities present the greatest results, and our *Nun* time, i.e., when action is imperative and immediate, not deferred.

"So be careful how you live.

Make the most of every opportunity because the days are evil.

Don't act thoughtlessly, but understand what the Lord

wants you to do. Be filled with the Holy Spirit

and be thankful for everything."
